

VETERINARY SURGEON'S NEW FOREST STALLION ACCEPTANCE GUIDE

The New Forest Pony Breeding and Cattle Society only allows Entrance to the New Forest Stud Book to those ponies who's sires have been Accepted and only permits Colts (after the 30th of April in the year that they attain 2 years of age) or Stallions to be shown in New Forest classes if they have been Accepted.

Acceptance is conditional upon the Stallion or Colt itself being Entered on the New Forest Stud Book and their having passed the Veterinary Examination/s by a Veterinary Surgeon approved by the Society for this purpose.

Colts or Stallions should normally undergo these Veterinary Examinations twice, by the 30th April of the years in which they attain the age of two and five years. The pony may also be liable to re-examination at any time on the decision of the Council of the above Society, by a Veterinary Surgeon appointed by the same Council. Any Stallion may also be liable to appraisal by Officials of the above Society at any time concerning non-veterinary aspects of acceptability.

Should a pony, of any age, be deemed unsuitable by the above Society, as a result of an examination or appraisal, an appeal may be made to the Society's Council who will appoint one or more Veterinary Surgeons, with or without one or more Officials of the above Society, to re-examine the animal and/or his offspring, if relevant and report to the aforementioned Council. The decision of this Council following consideration of the appeal and such report will be final and indisputable.

Any such appeal should be made to the above Society, in writing and accompanied by a remittance of £25, which shall only be returnable in the event of the appeal, being successful.

A DNA sample should only be taken on the pony passing it's first examination. The sample should be sent with the identifying DNA test form direct to the Laboratory in the envelope supplied.

The Veterinary Surgeon's report shall be submitted to the Society's Council upon the form supplied and approved by the Society. PLEASE NOTE: The diagram on the reverse of the form need only be completed if:

A. The Pony has an old style Registration Certificate without a diagram

B. The markings and/or diagram shown on the Certificate of Entry or Passport are not an accurate description of the pony or are incomplete. (There should be at least 5 points of identity shown.)

The Veterinary examination shall be such as to ensure recommendation of acceptance only for stallions free from clinical evidence of any Heritable Disease or deformity as laid down by the Society's Council and amended by them from time to time as found necessary (Appendix A) and of suitable conformation (Appendix B) and height (Appendix C)

APPENDIX A: Heritable conditions disqualifying stallions for acceptance by the New Forest Pony Breeding and Cattle Society.

- Defective Genital Organs, including rotation of one or both testicles.
- Cataract
- · Roaring or Whistling. .
- Ringbone, Sidebone, Navicular Disease.
- Bone Spavin.

- · Shivering.
- · Stringhalt.
- Luxation or Subluxation of the Patella.
- Overshot or Undershot Jaw.
- · Sweet Itch
- · Inguinal Hernia.

NOTE: A slight disproportion between the testicles in an immature Stallion may be accepted provisionally, conditional on later examination showing normally.

The Patella should not be luxatable by firm upward pressure, or any exercise.

The incisors, upper and lower, should be in contact for at least half their width when the head is at its normal angle.

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APPENDIX B: Conformation

In relation to the acceptability of a Stallion or Colt the New Forest Pony Breeding and Cattle Society is concerned to avoid the introduction of those faults of conformation, which may reduce the usefulness of a pony by interfering with correct gait, by rendering unsuitable for riding or driving, or which may predispose to future unsoundness.

Perfection of type and show quality are matters of opinion to be judged at shows and are not the concern of the Veterinary Surgeon. However the following should be mentioned in the report and if they are of sufficient degree or if several faults exist in combination, they are grounds for recommending rejection, as is a general disproportion:

- Malformations of the mouth, uneven wear of the teeth.
- Ewe neck, roach back, excessively long back.
- Upright shoulder.
- Flat or Club Feet, contracted feet or heels, disproportion of feet, thin or brittle hoof walls or soles.
- Base wide or base narrow, toe in or toe out in either the fore or hind limbs.
- Anterior or posterior stance of the fore or hind limbs.
- Unduly upright or excessively sloping pasterns.
- Lateral deviation of the metacarpals, tied in below the knees in front or behind.
- Posterior, anterior, lateral, medial deviation of the knees.
- Medial or lateral deviation of the hocks, excessive angulation of the hocks.
- Excessively straight hind legs.
- · Curby Hocks.

There should be due proportion of bone measurement below the knee to height and 5 year old or older ponies with less than the following relationships should be rejected.

Height at withers	Measurement of bone below knee
111 – 122 cms	15.25 cms
122 – 132 cms	16.5 cms
132 – 142 cms	17.75 cms
142 – 148 cms	20.3 cms

The measurements should be reported in all cases.

APPENDIX C: Height.

Height should be measured on firm standing, which is as level as possible.

The actual measurement shall be stated on the form with a note as to whether the pony was shod or unshod. In the case of a pony being shod an allowance of 1.25 cms may be made for the shoes.

No pony that exceeds 148 cms in height can remain the New Forest Pony Stud Book, where it is suspected that the pony exceeds 148 cms the New Forest Pony Breeding and Cattle Society should be notified.

Height as recorded shall not be admitted for any other purposes than description, unless measurement has been made under conditions of the Joint Measurement Scheme and this has been specifically certified by the examining Veterinary Surgeon.
